COMMISSIONER KIONNEE L. MCGHEE SPONSORS RESOLUTION AWARDING THE CARRIE MEEK FOUNDATION \$8.9 MILLION FOR **COMMUNITY VIOLENCE INTERVENTION INITIATIVES**



The Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved a resolution sponsored by District 9 Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee, to award The Carrie Meek Foundation funding to administer \$8.9 million for community-based violence intervention initiatives throughout Miami-Dade County. The Foundation, in partnership with Miami-Dade County, will administer, manage, and disburse funds over three years to non-profit organizations that will provide re-entry services, high-risk intervention work, mental health and survivor outreach and support services. Additionally, a portion of the funding will support organizations that address career training, food scarcity, youth development, and capacity building.

During the mile-long walk, community residents were energized to take action as the crowd chanted "Peace and love in Florida City." There was also a resource fair linking residents to services and information on access to healthcare, housing, and educational programming.
