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What can get funded? SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

Service Areas

- High-risk Interventionists: Place credible, trusted adults in communities to safely intervene and break the cycle of violence.
- Reentry Services: Support individuals returning from incarceration to successfully rejoin the community and achieve a positive, fresh start.
- Mental Health & Victim Outreach Services: Provide mental health and supportive resources for survivors and individuals impacted by gun violence.





What can get funded? SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

Grassroots Groups

- Can apply within any of the three Service Areas
- Programs and projects that develop and/or expand community-rooted efforts to reduce violence and/or improve safety in communities are also eligible:
 - STEAM-focused activities
 - Youth health and wellness activities
 - College and post-secondary prep
- Employment, internship and entrepreneurship support
- Food security and education programs

How large are these grants? SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

- Your funding request should reflect the proposed program's budget and the applicant's past organizational budget
- \$500,000 is the maximum grant size
- 18-month grant cycle, noting flexibility for one-time events or short-term activities
- We want to distribute these funds widely





Evaluating Applications SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

The Foundation will award grants to applicants that meet the eligibility criteria and whose proposal best achieves the overall SSC Program's goals.

- Approach (45 points)
- Relevant Experience, Past Performance, and Qualifications (20 points)
- Data Collection and Evaluation (15 points)
- Proposer's Budget and Financial Stability (10 points)
- Applicant's Funding Request (10 points)




