## The Partners SIPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

- Launched through a groundbreaking partnership between The Carrie Meek Foundation and Miami-Dade County
- Funding from the Miami-Dade County **Community Violence Intervention Initiative**
- 3-year collaboration with Miami-Dade County Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety

## Funded Service Areas SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

- High-risk Interventionists: Place credible, trusted adults in communities to safely intervene and break the cycle of violence.
- Reentry Services: Support individuals returning from incarceration to successfully rejoin the community and achieve a positive, fresh start.
- Mental Health & Victim Outreach Services: Provide mental health and supportive resources for survivors and individuals impacted by gun violence.
- Grassroots Groups: Community-rooted solutions to reduce violence and/or improve safety in communities.



# The Funding SUPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

The Supporting Safer Communities Program includes investing an amount not to exceed \$140,000 to provide capacity building and technical assistance to funded community organizations and grassroots groups. Services will be provided in direct support of grantees awarded through the SSC Program.

# SSC Applicants SIPPORTING SAFER COMMUNITIES

- 246 applicants applied.
- 13 individuals applied for the SSC Grant.
- 188 of the applicants stated that they were Grassroots.
- 74 of the applicants did not receive any funding last fiscal year.
- 60% of our applicants selected community-rooted solutions.
- Mental Health, Reentry, and High-Risk Interventions were almost evenly chosen as service areas.




